A documentary of an extraordinary woman, Estelle Ishigo, one of the few Caucasians to be interned with 120,000 Japanese-Americans in 1942. Estelle refused to be separated from her Japanese-American husband of 13-years and lived with him for three years behind barbed wire in the desolate Heart Mountain Internment Camp in Wyoming. Her sketches and watercolors formed a moving portrait of the lives of the internees, and the struggle to keep their health, dignity, and hopes alive.

The Program will include a Q&A Session with guests who were interned in the World War II Internment Camps. This is a special treat to be able to meet and hear from Japanese Americans who experienced the Internment Camps.
